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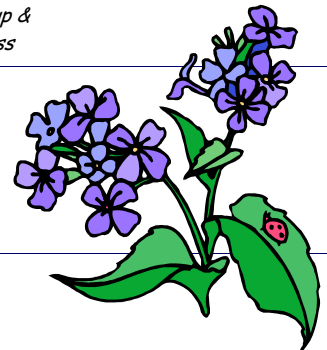

APRIL 2005 PROGRAM DAYS

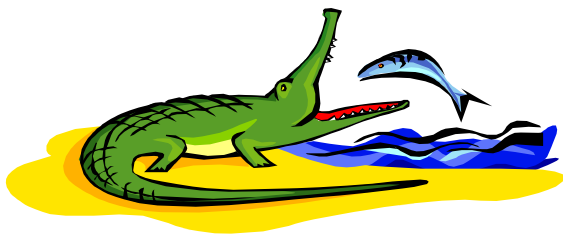


Wednesday, April 2, 2005

Wednesday, April 16, 2005

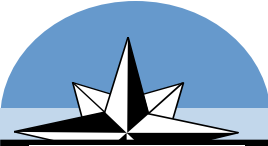
The program today will be a celebration of Earth and Science! Join us as our children share their science projects and/or Earth Day projects.

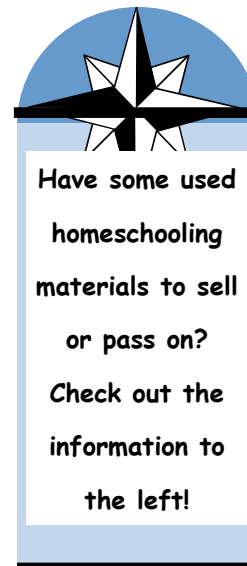

The Gym Group will meet on the 2nd & 4th Thursdays. Classes are held at the Lemont Park District (16028 w 127th St., in Lemont, IL).

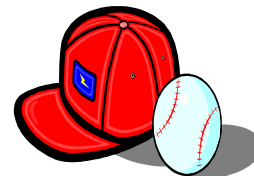
The April 2005 classes will be on April 10, 12:30—1:30,

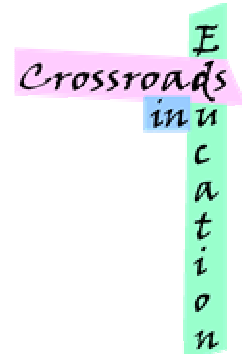
If you are unable to attend this planning meeting it is your responsibility to contact us for the graduation packet.



As members of the Crossroads in Education Study Cooperative, students and parents will be expected to fully participate. Please note the following:

Each week, we will open our study group day, promptly at 9:00am, with a Flag Ceremony, followed by any announcements. Class sessions will be broken down into the following time slots, including a lunch session:

- 9:00-9:15am - Flag Ceremony, announcements
- 9:15am-10:15am - First Session - Geography/History (Jr's); Language Arts (Teens)
- 10:15am-11:15am - Second Session - Art (Jr's); Science (Teens)
- 11:15am-Noon - Third Session - Sign Language (Both groups)
- Noon-12:30pm - Lunch Break - Everyone
- 12:30pm-1:30pm - Fourth Session - Science (Jr's); Art (Teens)
- 1:30pm - 2:00pm- Fellowship & Clean up
- Times will be adjusted as needed!



- ⇒ **The Crossroads in Education Study Cooperative does not and will not promote a particular religion.** However, after extensive review and research of educational materials, the facilitators have decided to use curriculum with a Christian emphasis.
- ⇒ **Fees are to be paid on time.** All fees for outside facilitators will be due in full on the first day of each 9 week session. Facility use fee is \$50 per week; this fee will be shared by member families. Facility use fee must be paid whether your family attends or not.
- ⇒ **Students are expected to bring their books and supplies each week.** Parents may need to help direct their "forgetful" students. We encourage using a designated backpack or bag just for this group.
- ⇒ **Students must do all assignments.** We are only with the kids for one hour per week, per class. There will be reading and other assignments that must be completed at home.
- ⇒ **If your family is late, please wait until the next class session begins before entering the classrooms.** It is too disruptive to have latecomers straggling in once class has begun.
- ⇒ **If you know your family will be absent, please contact one of the group facilitators.** We will provide contact phone numbers for members to call.
- ⇒ **Parents must help with the group.** Facilitators will provide information on assistance needed. This group is not a "drop off." Parents are required to stay at the facility during classes. We would like parents to plan field trips and outings (see calendar page for available Thursday dates or plan outings on a separate day of the week).
- ⇒ **Class facilitators will provide evaluations/assessments at the end of each 9 week session.** It is up to the parents to issue "grades" for the classes, if they choose.
- ⇒ **Preschool Age Siblings** - Preschool age siblings are not to be in the classrooms while sessions are going on. Parents of the preschoolers are asked to coordinate supervision of the youngsters while sessions are happening. There is usually an empty room available for the preschoolers, with adult(s) to use.
- ⇒ **Discipline Matters** - Parents are responsible for their own child(ren)'s behavior. If the facilitator feels a student is disruptive, the parent will be asked to remove the student from the class. Further discipline problems will be addressed as needed.
- ⇒ **Playing Outside** - We are welcome to use the grounds around the church area. We are also welcome in the ball field behind our building. Please remind students that they must stay off of the church sign and buildings! Teen members may be outside unaccompanied by an adult. No Jr. Crossroads members may play outside unless an adult is present.
- ⇒ **Hold Harmless Agreement** - Every parent will need to sign this agreement, which will be kept by the facility.
- ⇒ **Communication** - Every parent must check the email list on a regular basis. This email list is our main mode of communication. If you are unable to access your email it is your responsibility to contact another member for current information.
- ⇒ **Updating Expectations will be done as needed.** Last updated 11/6/04.

MEETING DAY REMINDERS

Please remember that our meetings start promptly at 9:00am. The doors will be opened at 8:40am.

For those facilitating first session classes: feel free to set up your rooms before our 9:00am start time.

At 9:00am, we will begin by having a group recitation of the *Pledge of Allegiance*. Miss Susy will ask two of the youth members to hold the flag and lead the group in the Pledge. Immediately following the recitation of the Pledge, we will provide ten minutes for any announcements. This will include items related

to the group, the facility and any other information deemed important by the parents in our group.

If your family is going to need to purchase lunch for the day, please arrange to do so during the language class. We do need to make sure there are at least two parents left in the class to provide any necessary aid to the language instructor.

Plan to pay your facility use fee to Karen during the lunch break or during the fourth session.

Kudos to the teens for doing a terrific job in vac-

uuming, sweeping and taking out the trash. The adults in the group HAVE noticed your efforts!

Thanks to all the moms who continue to provide such terrific support to those parents who are facilitating classes. This group is a wonderful inspiration to all of us!
